



Mission Statement:

The RAPP (Records Access Preservation and Protection) Committee is an ad hoc committee working in conjunction with the HSNY Archives Committee and other non-profit organizations charged with preserving the early history of New York. Its goal is to help locate and review, restore and conserve the historical assets specifically described in the Charter of the Holland Society of New York. The ultimate goal for RAPP in all cases involves making the assets available (sometimes through digitization) to the HSNY membership and, in selected cases, to the general public for a fee. Any profits generated from these activities will be cycled back into the Archives Committee to assist in funding its continuing work.

Recent activities include:

An informational meeting with Collegiate Church, The New York Historical Society and selected potential vendors held at the Holland Society offices in New York in June of last year.

A visit to the SurroundArt facility in Brooklyn with representatives from the Collegiate Church to investigate secure storage options for HSNY assets.
